

- Ability to motivate and manage others.
- Budget management skills.
- Commitment to the choice of charity made for/by your Civic Head.

Do's & Don'ts!



- Don't let your civic head make a public announcement as to how much they are going to raise during their year in office!
- Don't let your Civic Head focus on what the previous Civic Head raised.
- Don't blame yourself if fundraising targets are not met.
- Do give yourself time plan ahead for launches, press releases to obtain more attendees.
- Do ask your new Civic Head to think of their own contacts that could assist during the year.
- Do take advantage of working in a large building housing lots of staff.

- Raffle/Auction prizes/Unwanted Mayoral Gifts
- Free Help
 - Universities, Colleges, Schools
 - Armed Forces and Cadets
 - Volunteer organisations/Community Champions
 - Representatives of nominated charities
 - The more free help the more raised!

In current financial climate business/organisations also need publicity – so win win situation for all.



Think about : -

- Be aware of local demographics of the community.
- Themed events contact any supporting local clubs/associations.
- Varied priced events to suit all pockets.
- Larger annual events, smaller ad hoc events.
- Competitions for event suggestions.
